Lara is the President and CEO of the Greater Richmond Partnership (GRP), the national and international sales team which serves as the lead regional economic development organization. GRP is a public/private, non-profit that represents the city of Richmond and counties of Chapterfield, Henry and Henrica in the 1.2 million per



counties of Chesterfield, Hanover and Henrico in the 1.3 million population of the Richmond MSA in Virginia.

Prior to her role with GRP, she was the Director of Salt Lake City's Department of Economic Development (SLC DED) where she oversaw three divisions – Business Development, the Redevelopment Agency of Salt Lake City and the Salt Lake City Arts Council. Under her leadership, she worked to bring more than 30 new companies to Salt Lake City including UPS, Amazon, Stadler Rail, and others totaling over 9,000 jobs and nearly a billion dollars in capital investment.
